Record turnout as Venugopal, Koo win Seremban Half Marathon

NTERNATIONAL runner R. Venugopal and Koo Suet Lee won the Men's and Women's Open categories, respectively, in the Seremban Half Marathon (SHM) recently.

Venugopal, a former Malaysian Schools Sports Council (MSSM) champion, clocked 1'11:44s to finish ahead of M. Murali and P. Janarthanan.

Suet Lee, a 20-year-old nursing student from Ipoh, was thrilled to emerge as the winner in the
